- PISA stands in a tradition of international school studies, undertaken since the late 1950s by the <u>International Association</u> <u>for the Evaluation of Educational Achievement</u> (IEA).
- PISA aims at testing <u>literacy</u> in three competence fields: reading, mathematics, science on a 1000-point scale. [3]
- <u>TIMSS</u> is <u>Trends in International Mathematics and Science Study</u> (started in 1995), which in turn was much influenced by the U.S.
- National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP).
- IEA's Progress in International Reading Literacy Study (PIRLS).



Growth in Education Staffing Has Far Outpaced Student Enrollment


Since 1970, total student enrollment in public schools increased by 3.7 million, or 8 percent. However, during that same period, total education staffing rose by 2.8 million, or 84 percent. Most notable was the growth in non-teaching staff which increased by 138 percent.





Notes: Some figures have been interpolated. Figures for teachers and student enrollment for 2011 and Fall 2012 are projected.






